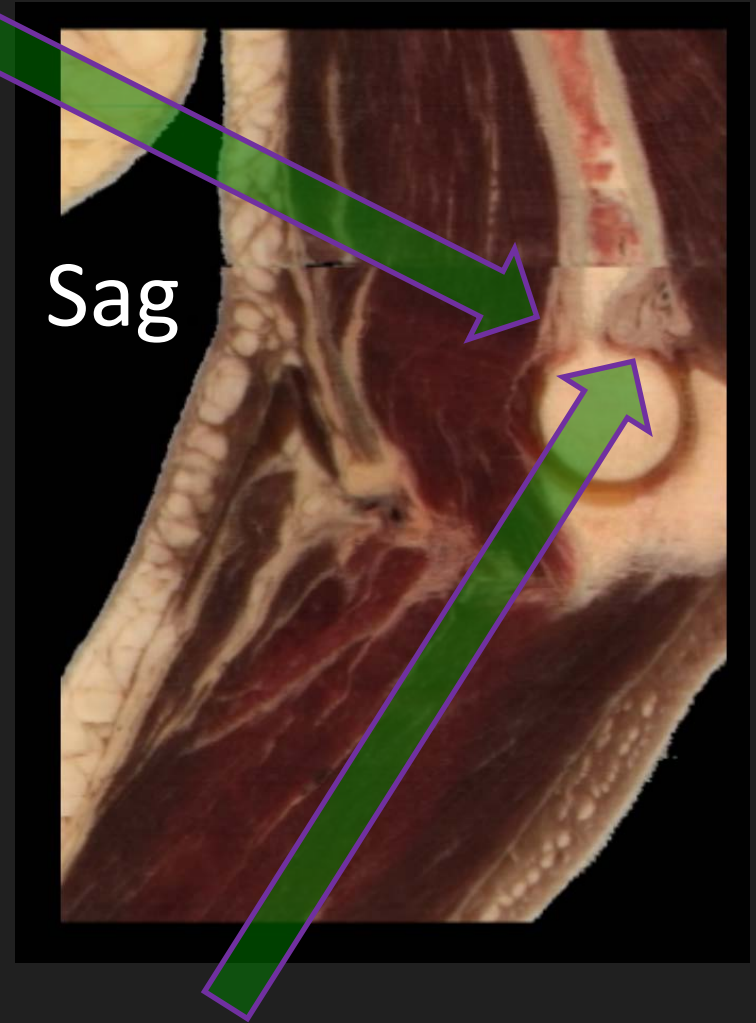


Anterior Fat Pad in Coronoid Fossa
